#### Inter-Agency Charges:

(1) Bureau of Commonwealth Payroll Operations (BCPO) Billing (Job 30) – Billing of \$150,493.29 for the PLCB's share of costs representing payroll services in FY 2020-21. The billing is based on a corrected actual payroll transaction count largely from (FY 2020). BCPO made an error over calculating another bureau in FY 2021, this resulted in under billing the PLCB last year FY 2021. The PLCB's transaction rate with the correction is within historical means however further clarification will be requested.

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.
