B. Announcement by the Chairman for Ratification of a Board Action:

The following Board Action, approved on April 21, 2023, was decided by Notational Voting after the adjournment of the Board's last public meeting on April 5, 2023.

On February 22, 2023, the City of Lock Haven filed a completed application pursuant to section 493.1(b) of the Liquor Code to allow their own noise ordinance to supersede the statute regarding amplified sound. A hearing was held before a hearing examiner within the proposed exempted area of Lock Haven on March 24, 2023. There were no protests to the application.

Section 493.1(b) requires the Board to act on the request within 60-days of the receipt of the application which would be April 24, 2023. As the next Board session is scheduled for May 3, 2023, this matter was brought to the Board for a notational vote so that it may act on the request prior to the statutory deadline.

Chairman Holden, Member Isenhour and Member Vulakovich agreed (3-0 vote) to approve the application for municipal noise exemption for the City of Lock Haven from July 31, 2023, to July 31, 2028.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Patti Smith from Rock the Capital was recognized for public comment. Ms. Smith pointed out that there was no public notice on the website of the previous meeting being canceled when she tried to find the agenda on the PLCB website. Ms. Smith stated she called Secretary Vigoda asking about the meeting. Secretary Vigoda remarked that he had placed a public notice in the newspaper in accordance with the Sunshine Act. Ms. Smith offered that a notice on the website would be helpful as well. Chairman Holden concurred with Ms. Smith's suggestion.

Ms. Smith asked why the PLCB complies with the Sunshine Act for public notices but not for other issues. Chief Counsel Diaz offered that the PLCB complies with the Sunshine Act, and clarified that certain issues do not have to be discussed in public under the act.

Peter Laurenzano asked if the PLCB still sends out notifications via regular mail or whether the PLCB only uses email. Chief Counsel Diaz explained that the Liquor Code requires certain notices to be sent by regular mail. However, there are notices that are sent via email if the Liquor Code is not specific. Mr. Diaz also explained that depending on the type of notice, both regular mail and email could be used. Mr. Laurenzano inquired if Board decisions are sent via email or regular mail. Chaiman Holden asked Mr. Laurenzano to clarify if he was inquiring about the method of transmission of information about any Board action. Mr. Laurenzano stated he was asking about hypothetical letters sent by the Director of Regulatory Affairs that would ask for response or that would provide information about necessary action. Chief Counsel Diaz stated that Mr. Laurenzano was veering into the specifics of Mr. Laurenzano's own pending litigation and Chief Counsel Diaz did not expand further on the already-offered generic response to the question.

Mr. Laurenzano further addressed the Board as to the current status of the litigation. He stated that he found errors in the ALJ opinion, affirmed by the Board, which could have been corrected with direct communication. Mr. Laurenzano indicated he would be looking to recover his legal fees, and named several PLCB employees as persons from whom he might seek to recover directly. Mr. Laurenzano further indicated that it was his preference to settle the matter out of court. Chairman Holden stated that it was his understanding Mr. Laurenzano was represented by counsel. Mr. Laurenzano affirmed this, and went on to state he speaks for himself; he added that his case is a high personal priority, and that he expects accountability related to it.

Franco Grisafi from Cracker Barrel communicated via the Microsoft Teams chat due to microphone issues. Mr. Grisafi asked if the Bureau of Licensing agenda item number two was approved. Board Secretary Vigoda indicated that it was approved unanimously.

NEXT BOARD MEETING

The next meeting of the PLCB will be a formal meeting on Wednesday, May 17, 2023 beginning at 11:00 A.M. Prior to the public meeting, there will be an Executive Session to discuss matters of personnel and to engage in non-deliberative informational discussions, some of which are regarding actions and matters which have been approved at previous public meetings.
