(2) Contract for Services with Deloitte, LLP, for Production Support and Associated Services for Oracle Cloud Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) and Oracle Applications – Engagement to have Deloitte, LLP, perform the ERP "hypercare" duties (i.e.; post-go-live production support and maintenance and associated knowledge transfer) after Oracle's roll-off. The two entities will overlap for two months to ensure a smooth transition.

Procured via RFP No. 20220912 – VENDOR: **Deloitte, LLP -** TERM: November 1, 2023, Effective date, through April 30, 2024, with an option to renew for any quarterly increments of an additional 18 months. - estimated cost for initial 6-month term: **\$1,822,080.00.**

(3) **Background Check Services** – PLCB will be using this contract to perform pre-employment criminal background checks to ensure that the agency is in compliance with the Liquor Code.

Procured via IFB No. 270094 – VENDOR: Accurate C&S Services – TERM: One year from effective date - \$100,000.00 estimated cost.

(4) Ingenico Lane 8000 PIN Pads and Stands – This order is for the future to be used as spares as we see tamper errors on the pin pads and also for anticipated new stores.

Procured via DGS Contract #4400016084 – VENDOR: First Data Merchant Services LLC - **\$247,750.00 estimated cost** (250 PIN Pads @ \$975.00 and 50 stands @ \$80.00).

Inter-Agency Charges:

(1) Civil Service Commission Services (CSCS) (Job 46) – Billing of \$237,307.73 for SCSC services for July – December 2023. The billing was based on the PLCB's average total count of civil service positions (7,163 filled and vacant) for the six-month period of November/2022 through April/2023. The PLCB's billing increased by \$42,377.10 (+21.7%) from last year's billing of \$194,930.63. The billing methodology uses "total" civil service positions (filled + vacant).

- (2) Office of Administration HR Shared Services Billing of \$970,200 for the FY 2023-24 Q1 the LCB's allocated share of OA's HR-Enterprise Services (HR service center, training, labor relations, employee benefits, SEAP, etc.). The billing is \$46,200 (+5.0%) more than last year. The billing is allocated based on the agency's number of benefit eligible employees (BEEs). The LCB's Q1 charges represents only 3.9% of the total OA charge of \$24.9 million which grew (+5.0%) over last year.
- (3) Office of Administration IT Shared Services Billing of \$834,094 for the FY 2023-24 Q1 estimate for OA's IT Enterprise Technology Essential Services. This billing is for enterprise-wide infrastructure, network, security, enterprise data center (EDC) and service desk costs. The LCB's charge represents 1.1% of the total \$78.2M OA- IT Shared Services billing (+5.0%) over last year. This billing is \$39,719 (+5.0%) higher than the FY 2022-23 Q4 billing.

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.
