# PUBLIC MEETING - 11:00 A.M

CALL TO ORDER ...... Chairman Holden

Board Secretary Michael Vigoda indicated that a quorum of the Board was present, and Chairman Holden called the meeting to order.

### ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

As explained in the printed Meeting Agenda, certain matters being presented for "official action" at today's meeting have been discussed during Executive Sessions held prior to today's meeting as permitted by the Sunshine Act.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

The Board reserved 10 minutes for public comment.

Constance Rankin addressed the Board regarding the Borough of Bellevue's application for a municipal noise exemption. She requested that the Board deny the application, citing that the public was not given an opportunity to effectively comment due to an improper notice of the hearing. Ms. Rankin also pointed out that the ordinance lacks an objective standard for determining excessive noise from establishments with

liquor licenses. She expressed doubt that the Borough intends to enforce any reasonable noise standards and reiterated her desire for the Board to reject the application, calling for a new hearing with proper public notice to gather additional evidence.

Richelle Wimer also spoke to the Board about the Borough of Bellevue's noise exemption application. She shared her own unresolved noise issues with a neighboring establishment and the lack of assistance from the Bellevue Borough Council. Ms. Wimer criticized the Council for spreading false information about the PLCB's handling of complaints and claimed that the Council and the PLCB had provided inadequate notice of the hearing. She stated that the Council was to notify residents of the hearing by text message, but she learned upon inquiry that the meeting had already occurred. Ms. Wimer urged the Board to refuse the application due to the misinformation, lack of proper hearing notice, and her belief that the Council's intentions are to act in the best interest of the businesses and not the citizens.

Chairman Holden asked Chief Counsel Jason Worley to provide explanation and context. Mr. Worley clarified the Sunshine Act requirements, which mandate public notification at least 24 hours in advance in a newspaper of general circulation. He stated that the hearing notice was published on June 5, 2024, in the Pittsburgh Courier, with the hearing held on June 12, 2024. He explained that the PLCB typically consults the impacted municipality for the best newspaper for advertisements but cannot control the municipality's actions to inform residents. Mr. Worley noted that noise exemption petitions are common, with first-time applicants usually granted a one-year exemption. For extensions, municipalities must reapply and go through the same process. He offered to consider recommendations for better newspapers for future notices from both Ms. Rankin and Ms. Wimer.
