Dear Mr. Cantilo:

After evaluation of your proposal in response to RFP #OGC-2024-19 Insurance Law – Solvency/RBC Counsel RFP, by the Office of General Counsel ("OGC") on behalf of the Pennsylvania Insurance Department ("Insurance"), I hereby appoint your firm Cantilo & Bennett, L.L.P., one of the Firms ("Firms") to represent the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Insurance, in the above-referenced matter. With respect to the Risk-Based Capital Statutes, this engagement may include review of RBC Plans or revised RBC Plans, examination or analysis of the assets, liabilities and operations of troubled insurance companies, formulation of a Corrective Order, handling related litigation and provision of legal advice. With respect to the Examination Law, this engagement may include acting as an examiner, handling related litigation and the provision of legal advice. The scope of engagement may also include could include seeking an administrative declaration of insolvency and
