- ▶ 83.5% of PA Homicides involved firearms
 PSP Annual Firearms Report
- ► Two-thirds of domestic violence homicide victims in PA were killed with a gun PCADV's Domestic Violence Fatality Report

PCCD approved a total of \$56.5M in funding for 113 projects to reduce community and gun violence and support afterschool programming.

Expanding Investments in the 2025-26 Budget

With a record number of applications for funding last year, the Shapiro-Davis Administration is stepping it up and proposing an additional \$20M to help more communities stop violence before it happens.
