Five Points Intersection Construction Update: Summer 2024

Utility Work Continues Through Summer

Spring/Summer 2024 – Utility work is underway through September on the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's (PennDOT) \$14.2 million project to improve travel and safety at the Route 309 (Bethlehem Pike), Route 463 (Horsham Road/Cowpath Road), and Business U.S. 202 (Doylestown Road) Intersection, commonly referred to as the Five-Points Intersection, in Montgomery Township, Montgomery County.

Short-term travel restrictions will be in place during off-peak daytime (9:00 AM to 3:00 PM) and overnight (7:00 PM to 5:00 AM) hours Mondays through Fridays while utility crews install and relocate electric, gas, sewer, water and fiber optic lines along Route 309 (Bethlehem Pike) Route 463 (Cowpath/Horsham roads) and Business U.S.202 (Doylestown Road) in the vicinity of the intersection.

Beginning in early fall, motorists will encounter long-term shoulder closures and periodic lane closures and shifting traffic patterns on all three approach roadways as PennDOT's contractor begins work to expand the intersection by installing additional through lanes and turn lanes at the busy juncture of three major roadways.

In addition to expanding the intersection from15-to-18 lanes, other improvements include upgrading and retiming signalization; installing sidewalks, ADA curb ramps, and guiderail; upgrading stormwater drainage, signage, and pavement markings; adjusting driveway access; and reducing erosion sediment.

Road-Con, Inc. of West Chester, Chester County, is the general contractor on this project, which is financed with 100 percent federal funds.
