

What is an autocyycle?

An autocyycle is a three-wheeled motorcycle that has a steering wheel and seating that does not require the operator to straddle or sit astride. These vehicles typically have bucket seats, seat belts, a steering wheel, and gas and brake pedals similar to a car. Autocycles are registered as a motorcycle.

What type of license do I need to operate an autocyycle?

The operator of an autocyycle needs a Class C driver's license to operate the vehicle. A motorcycle license (Class M) is not required.

Can I take my Class C driver's skills test in an autocyycle?

No, a Class C driver's skills test must be taken in Class C passenger vehicle.

Can I take my Class M motorcycle driver's skill test in an autocyycle?

No. An autocyycle, although considered a motorcycle by body type, drives very differently than a motorcycle and a Class M license is not needed to operate it.

Do I need to wear a motorcycle helmet when driving an autocyycle?

All motorcycle laws and regulations will apply to an autocyycle, including the motorcycle helmet law. For more information about the helmet law in Pennsylvania, please see Pennsylvania's Motorcycle Helmet Law Fact Sheet.

Are there any passenger restrictions when driving an autocyycle?

Yes. An operator of an autocyycle may not carry a passenger who is under eight years old in the autocyycle.

Can I take a motorcycle safety course in an autocyycle?

Currently, there is no course available that could accommodate an autocyycle.
